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### What is ASA?

The American Subcontractors Association, Inc. is a federation composed of local and state chapters and the national organization. Chapters operate in their respective cities under the bylaws of ASA. They are responsible for organizing their chapters, providing programs and events for their members, participating in local, state and regional legislative and regulatory issues and developing membership recruitment and retention programs to keep their chapters active.

ASA members work in masonry, drywall, plumbing, steel, electrical, mechanical, flooring – nearly every specialty trade in the construction industry. Members are also suppliers to the construction industry such as insurance, materials, consulting, - almost every construction industry need is offered through other members. ASA members are both union and open shop and range in size from the smallest private firms to the nation's largest specialty contractors.

### Why was ASA of Oklahoma formed?

Several industry leaders in the state realized a need for a voice for the subcontractor – an association dedicated to the concerns of the subcontractor. ASA of Oklahoma was formed in the fall of 2002 as a local ASA Chapter – full chapter status was earned by March, 2003. ASA of Oklahoma is *the* resource for networking, education and legislative representation on both the local and national level. Interacting within a non-competitive environment, subcontractors in Oklahoma are now able to share information and learn from each other's experience. Our chapter was formed because professionals in the state realized the need and they are committed to working with other professional subcontractors to address issues and concerns specific to the subcontractors needs.

### Membership Dues \$795 per year

Members can be subcontractors, material suppliers, and service suppliers. General contractors, Architects, Engineers are not eligible for membership. Members are encouraged to attend the monthly meetings held in both Oklahoma City and Tulsa. Annual dues paid to the Oklahoma Chapter include full membership with the National ASA with full membership benefits of ASA National. (See National dues schedule for dues paid to local chapter after July. 1, 2005)

### Founding Membership \$5,000

A founding member receives local chapter and national dues paid for 5 years, and a recognition plaque acknowledging the commitment to the success of the ASA of Oklahoma. Founding members are extended ex-officio status on the Board of Directors of ASA of Oklahoma.

Members are encouraged to serve on committees and have an active role in making the association a dynamic strong influence in the state.
